Microdermabrasion Halifax - The condition of Dermatitis Herpetiformis is a chronic skin condition characterized by blisters filled with a watery fluid. It is likewise referred to as DH or Duhring's Disease. The name implies the meaning in that it is a skin disease which has the certain appearance like herpes, though, the condition is not related to or caused by the herpes virus. DH was initially described in 1884 by Dr. Louis Duhring, thus the name. During 1867, a correlation between gluten intolerance or celiac disease and DH was recognized. In most of cases, the age of onset is usually 15 to 40 years, even though, DH can likewise have an effect on the elderly as well as kids. Women and men are equally affected. The prevalence of DH varies from 1 in 400 to 1 in 10,000.

Indications

DH has a characteristic rash that contains chronic papulovesicular eruptions and is extremely itchy. Typically, this rash is distributed symmetrically on extensor surfaces like for instance the elbows, knees, buttocks, back and back of neck. The blisters could range from being up to 1 cm across to extremely small. As this particular condition is extremely itchy intensive, the desire to scratch can be overwhelming. This could cause the individual to truly scratch blisters off before they could be checked by a medical doctor. Intense itching or intense burning sensation are sometimes felt prior to blisters appearing in a particular area.

If not treated, the severity of DH could significantly change in time. Generally, the signs initially appear in the early years of adulthood, usually between 20 and 30 years old. The very first obvious symptoms are the small vesicles or papules that resemble blisters or bumps. The initial indications are intensive itching and burning. Generally, the very first blisters appear on the shoulders, on the lower end of the spinal column, along the hairline and sometimes in the mouth. Rarely, does the rash occur on other mucous membranes other than the mouth or the lips. If gluten ingestion is avoided and the right medication is given, the symptoms normally disappear. In several cases, taking oral contraceptives may worsen the signs.

The indications of DH tend to come and go, in short periods of time, yet are always persistent. These indications could be accompanied by tiredness and abdominal pain and several symptoms of celiac disease.

The rash which is caused by DH forms and disappears in 3 stages. Initially, the individual might see a slight discoloration of the skin where the lesions appear. After that, the skin lesions transform into obvious papules and vesicles that are likely to happen in groups. The healing stage of the lesions is the last stage of development. Often this set of symptoms is characterized by a skin color change. This can result in parts of the skin turning darker or lighter compared to the color of the skin somewhere else on the body. Due to the intense itching, people generally scratch which can lead to the formation of crusts.
